

FROM THE DESK OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

MR. DJ SHEPARDSON

As we move toward the final four months of the school year, the district enters into a very busy time. Budget development continues to move forward and we continue to gather further information in terms of anticipated revenue from both the state and federal level. In addition, students are progressing forward in their studies and the West Canada Valley Class of 2022 is entering the final months of their senior year. As we look ahead, the district plans to hold commencement outdoors on the football field as we did last year. Commencement is scheduled for June 25, 2022. As we get closer, the district will communicate the details to everyone.

Capital Project – The district continue to move forward with the planning and development of the upcoming project. The district's consultants are developing drawings and developing detailed cost associations related to the approved project items. In addition, the district is working with our consultants to maximize federal funding and National Grid incentives to limit the overall cost of this project.

Budget Season – The district has devoted a great deal of time and effort building our budget for the 2022-2023 school year. The governor's proposed budget has provided West Canada Valley with a slight increase (3%) in operating aid in comparison to the previous year. With much of our revenue dependent on state aid, the district will watch closely as future discussions occur at both the state and federal level. As always, we will work diligently to provide a program that is high quality for our students and responsible to the taxpayers. We look forward to your support throughout this process.

Regents Exams/State Assessments-As we continue to promote strong foundation skills in our young students the district recognizes that our curriculum/assessment practices are an important piece of student development. The district has continued to work diligently on curriculum development as well as our instructional strategies during the past year. This will continue to be a high priority as we move forward. This year's state assessments including Regents exams are still under discussion at both the federal and state level. Districts across the state are expecting guidance in the upcoming months on the requirements and the proposed testing schedules. We continue to work through the pandemic and understand our teachers and students continue to face unusual circumstances. Once we know what tests are being made available and the schedule; we will certainly communicate to all stakeholders.

Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) – Our educational community continues to work with multiple stakeholders including the New York State Education Department to identify areas of strength and weakness in our academic programing. This has led to the development of a comprehensive plan to improve upon all academic areas as we move forward as a district. This has been a great opportunity for the district to reflect upon all of its achievements as well as develop plans that will take the district to the next level academically. To accomplish this, we continue to look at all areas of our academic program.

The pandemic has and will continue to present new challenges to our educational planning. The district continues the ongoing assessment of those needs and is making plans to address learning gaps that may exist at this time. BOARD OF EDUCATION

THREE OPEN SEATS

Petitions are available in the District Office for candidates interested in running for a seat on the School Board. Qualified district residents will be electing three (3) members to the Board of Education on Tuesday, May 17, 2022 from 12-8pm in the MS/HS lobby. The following board members have terms that will expire on June 30, 2022: Mrs. Jessica Bartlett, Mr. Roger Kemler and Mrs. Shauna Michael.

To qualify for membership on a school board an individual:

- Must be able to read and write
- Must be a qualified voter of the district; that is, a citizen of the United States, at least 18 years of age or older, and not adjudged to be an incompetent
- Must be and have been a resident (but need not be a taxpayer) of the district for a continuous and uninterrupted period of at least one year immediately before the election
- May not have been removed from any school district office within the preceding year
- May not reside with another member of the same school board as a member of the same family
- May not be a current employee of the school
- May not simultaneously hold another incompatible public office

Candidate's petitions must be returned to the District Clerk no later than 5:00PM on April 18, 2022 and must contain a minimum of 25 qualified voters' signatures. REMINDERS FROM OUR NURSES

Sports Physical Exams:

If any student plans to participate in a school sport they must have an updated physical exam on file. It is best to have your child check with the Health Office prior to the start of all sports seasons to ensure that their physical exam has not expired.

Working Papers:

If any student will need working papers for employment an updated physical exam must be on file with the Health Office. If one is not on file working papers cannot be issued.

Physical Examinations:

New York State Law requires a health examination for all students entering the school district for the first time and when entering Pre-K, K, 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th and 11th grade. Physicals are acceptable that have been performed no longer than 12 months prior to the 1st day of school in September.

Attendance:

If your child is going to be absent from school for any reason please contact the health office.

Sorry, but we cannot allow a student to have additional food items without paying for them.

RADIUM GIRLS

West Canada Valley Drama Club is pleased to present Radium Girls, a two-act play written by DW Gregory, a show based on actual events that occurred around Orange, New Jersey between 1918 and 1928. This play is inspired by the true life stories of three girls, Grace Fryer (Grace VanEtten), Katheryn Schaub (Olivia Clark), and Irene Rudolph (Annabelle Allen) who worked for US Radium Corporation and were poisoned by the radium in the paint used to illuminated



watch dials for the troops. After learning of their illness, and with the help of activist Katherine Wiley (Danelle Shannon-Dineen), they took on the president of the company, Arthur Roeder (Oren Valerio), and his associates, Edward Markley (Julius Grower) and CB "Charlie" Lee (Matthew Lape), which resulted in a classic conflict of working class versus corporate greed. These events are narrated by reporters, Jack Youngwood (Anthony Smith) and Nancy Jane Harlan (Hailey Haynes), who add to the action with their fast paced delivery. The action is further enhanced by testimonials of scientists Dr. VonSochocky (Ash Muthig) and Dr. Marie Curie (Olivia Ray). A poignant glimpse into the life of Grace Fryer is included, with scenes portraying her fiance (Tyler Reinhardt) and her mother (Leanne Kennedy).

Radium Girls is fast-paced and thought provoking, chronicling the lives of the "ghost girls", young factory girls who literally glowed from the chemicals they worked with every day. Their efforts to stand up to the executives at US Radium Corp improved factory conditions for all, and their plight is an accurate and timely glimpse into American history. This production is directed by Mrs. Patricia Lang and Mrs. Joyce Patti. It is codirected by Dramatic Literature students Grace VanEtten, Olivia Clark, Annabelle Allen, and Hailey Haynes, all of whom also have major dramatic roles in the show. Additionally, the performance incorporates unique and complex set design and lighting, a challenging task taken on by Stage Crew Director, John Flanagan, and Stage Crew members, Nadia Paul, Louis Clarke, and Madelyn Allen.

Drama Club is thrilled to be back on stage after a two year absence, and the students have learned so much in preparation for this production. 




YEARBOOK FAMILY AD
